## December 2021 Manager's report

### **11-19-21 GBERBA Policy/Tech Joint meeting - Mountain Lake**

This was the first in-person meeting that GBERBA had since March 2020. Attendance seemed to be less than prior joint meetings. Of interest was discussion of a MDM plan and culvert assessment in Watonwan Watershed and if it was eligible for 1W1P funds. Tim Grant from Blue Earth County did a presentation on well sealing efforts.

### **Hwy 14 Soil Health Tour**

Set to be March 1-4 with the Waseca stop on the 4<sup>th</sup>. Speakers include Don Reicosky on soil Carbon and agronomist Dorian Gatchell on transitions to soil health systems. We will likely do a short informational session on cost share opportunities. We are looking for local producers to either do a presentation on the practical side of soil health operations or on a panel. Funding to come from Le Sueur Civic Engagement through the MPCA. The I-90 tour will be in the second week of February, with the Albert Lea stop on Feb 9. We anticipate helping advertise for this event since they will have different speakers and Waseca landowners will likely attend.

### **11-30-21 – Le Sueur 1W1P Technical Advisory Committee**

This was the first meeting of this group and was facilitated well by Freshwater. While attendance was good, participation and feedback were less than desired. This may have been due to it being a virtual meeting and participants trying to get a sense of what was going on. Priority issue statements and sub-watershed boundaries were reviewed and there did not seem to be any obvious opposition to what was proposed.

### **12-1-21 – Cannon Implementation Group (CIG)**

MPCA did a presentation on anticipated water monitoring. The CRWJPB will likely contract with MPCA to do the stream water sampling. There is one location within Waseca County for stream sampling and we anticipate coordinating with P&Z to complete this work. Effort and expenses to be reimbursed by MPCA. Staff provided updates on the outreach and education plan, septic inventories, lake management plans, and shoreline inventory. Staff are working on revising the eligibility and ranking sheets. Soil Health effort to include a watershed wide soil health team to coordinate three events and three peer to peer groups throughout the watershed with some contracting going to Clean River Partners (CRP). We discussed our interest in pursuing a plan amendment to get the "Waseca Lakes Area" included in the "Lakes Area" for implementation eligibility. Next steps include meeting with BWSR staff to try to get a better understanding of staff effort, cost, and amendment requirements. We will need to consider if the effort and cost will be worth the potential future benefit of project eligibility.

### **WCA**

One of the restoration orders has asked for an amendment for an alternative method of restoration that has been reviewed and OK'd by the TEP. An additional restoration order is needed for fill in a wetland next to a lake.

### **CREP**

Application period is open with no current interested applicants. Two wetland restorations were completed in the last couple of weeks. Restoration was made easier by dry and warm conditions. FSA is still a bottleneck for payment processing and they have additional staff leaving.
